How do I revise effectively?	Work backwards from the checklists and past questions provided. Use these to make consolidated notes with examples – making sure you cover the key debates within each topic. Once you have an outline of each topic test yourself on the AO1 knowledge. You can do this by covering your notes and testing yourself, making flash cards or using the Seneca, Quizlet, Tutor2u or prechewed pre-made quizzes. The final stage is to make essay plans for past questions. You will not know how well you have learned the knowledge until you have applied it to the question. The more of these you do the competent you will be.
